Complaint

Comes Now, Webster Bivens, plaintiff
in the above entitled cause, depose and
SAYS:

1. This Court has jurisdiction to enter-
tain this complaint under the Civil Rights
Act of 1871, title 42 U.S.C., section 1983,
and title 28 U.S.C., sections 1331 (A) and
1343 (3) and (4).

2. While acting under the colors and
authority of the United States of America,
six (6) Agents of the U.S. Narcotic Bureau, did
violate plaintiff's constitutional rights, the
facts are as follows.

Webster Bivens

Facts

1. Plaintiff is, and at all times pertinent to this action, has been a citizen of the United States.
2. Each of the defendants is, and at all times pertinent to this action has been a agent of the Federal Narcotic Bureau, of the United States and was acting under color of authority of the laws of the United States.
3. On November 26, 1965, plaintiff was in his apartment at 547 Taylor Ave., Bronx, New York City, when defendants entered said apartment, searched it, and placed plaintiff under arrest for violation of narcotic laws.
4. Neither of the defendants ever had any warrant to enter plaintiff's apartment or search the same, nor did either of them have any warrant to arrest plaintiff.
5. Defendants used unreasonable force in effecting the arrest and restraint of plaintiff at his apartment, and
